Item 6. Indemnification of Directors and Officers

The Michigan Business Corporation Act provides that, under certain circumstances, directors, officers, employees and agents of a Michigan corporation may be indemnified against expenses, judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with settling, or otherwise disposing of, suits or threatened suits to which they are a party or threatened to be named a party by reason of acting in any of such capacities if such person acted in a manner such person believed in good faith to be in, or not opposed to, the best interest of the corporation. The bylaws of the Registrant provide for indemnification of officers and directors to the fullest extent permitted by such Michigan law. The Registrant's Articles of Incorporation also limit the potential personal monetary liability of the members of the Registrant's Board of Directors to the Registrant or its stockholders for certain breaches of their duty of care or other duties as a director. The Registrant maintains (i) director and officer liability insurance that provides for indemnification of the directors and officers of the Registrant and of its subsidiaries, and (ii) company reimbursement insurance that provides for indemnification of the Registrant and its subsidiaries in those instances where the Registrant and/or its subsidiaries indemnified its directors and officers.

(3) To remove from registration by means of a post-effective amendment any of the securities being registered which remain unsold at the termination of the offering.

The undersigned Registrant hereby undertakes that, for purposes of determining any liability under the Securities Act of 1933, each filing of the Registrant's annual report pursuant to Section 13(a) or Section 15(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (and, where applicable, each filing of an employee benefit plan's annual report pursuant to section 15(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934) that is incorporated by reference in the Registration Statement shall be deemed to be a new registration statement relating to the securities offered therein, and the offering of such securities at that time shall be deemed to be the initial BONA FIDE offering thereof.

Insofar as indemnification for liabilities arising under the Securities Act of 1933 may be permitted to directors, officers and controlling persons of the Registrant pursuant to the foregoing provisions, or otherwise, the Registrant has been advised that in the opinion of the Securities and Exchange Commission such indemnification is against public policy as expressed in the Act and is, therefore, unenforceable. In the event that a claim for indemnification against such liabilities (other than the payment by the Registrant of expenses incurred or paid by a director, officer or controlling person of the Registrant in the successful defense of any action, suit or proceeding) is asserted by such director, officer or controlling person in connection with the securities being registered, the Registrant will, unless in the opinion of its counsel the matter has been settled by controlling precedent, submit to a court of appropriate jurisdiction the question whether such indemnification by it is against public policy as expressed in the Act and will be governed by the final adjudication of such issue.
